#### **HISTORICAL**



#### OLD JAIL MUSEUM 11 Courthouse Drive 301-475-2467 stmaryshistory.org

Built in 1858 and in use until 1942, the granite block and brick structure retains its original

upstairs cells where prisoners were once held. The jail keeper's quarters downstairs house artifacts that relate county history. A cannon from The Ark, one of two ships that first brought colonists to Maryland, and later used to defend St. Mary's City, is displayed on the grounds. The museum also serves as a county visitor information center and houses exhibits of the St. Mary's County Historical Society.

It is also a National Park Service Underground Railroad Network to Freedom site. Runaway slaves were often held in public jails until their owners retrieved them or they were sold in compensation for the cost of care. Five stories of runaway slaves are connected with this jail. Open Thursday's and Friday's 10 am to 2 pm. Special tours and hours are available by advanced arrangement. Free admission.

#### TUDOR HALL 41680 Tudor Place 301-475-2467 stmaryshistory.org

Tudor Hall is an important 18th century house in Leonardtown,

Maryland. An example of Georgian architecture, it is the oldest building in Leonardtown. Tudor Hall was built by the Barnes family, either Abraham or his son, Richard, both of whom were active in the American Revolution. The name Tudor Hall was given to the house by a 19th century owner, Henry G.S. Key, a cousin of Francis Scott Key.

Some sites are open to the public, while others are private residences or offices.

Here in St. Mary's County we are blessed with an abundance of beautiful water that practically surrounds our county. The Town is committed to this effort and has accomplished many projects over the last several years that have made a huge difference to the health of Breton Bay. Even though this project was state mandated and does not gain any additional capacity for future growth, it turns this facility into a state-of-the-art treatment plant that significantly lowers the environmental impact to Breton Bay and our surrounding waters. We are proud of this facility and are serious about our responsibility to keep our Town and the waters that surround it, beautiful and healthy for future generations to enjoy as much as we do.

#### Trash and Recycling Information



Bulk Trash Pickup – Bulk trash pickup always falls on the first Thursday or Friday (depending on your regular pickup day) of March, June, September and December. So the next quarterly bulk trash

pickup dates will be September 7 & 8, 2017 and December 7 & 8, 2107. Bulk items such as bicycles, sofas, tables, chairs, etc, will be collected with your regular trash and should be placed at the curb together on these dates. Paint cans are considered a hazardous material and will not be picked up. Stoves, dishwashers and refrigerators can also be picked up. Refrigerators must have the freon removed and must be tagged by a certified technician.

**Holiday Pickup** – Labor Day is Monday, September 4th, so for that week slide your pickup day one day forward. For example, trash pickup scheduled for Monday will slide forward to Tuesday and so on for that week. Recyclables will also slide forward on those weeks and be picked up on Thursday.
